The Waikato-Tainui Endowed College Trust is inviting applications from appropriately qualified academics for the role of inaugural Academic Director of the College.

This role is initially for a fixed term of two years.

Based at Hopuhopu, Ngaruawahia, the College is a purpose-built facility, offering accommodation for up to 30 post-graduate students.

The Trust Board's objective is to have the first cohort of students in residence later in 2010.

The new Academic Director is expected to provide academic and research leadership to the College, working alongside the Administrative Director and reporting to the College Trustees.

A key responsibility will be to bring the College to fruition and to play a pivotal role in establishing a leading international facility offering a relevant and distinctive portfolio of programmes and initiatives.

A core focus of the position includes creating meaningful relationships with tertiary organisations both in New Zealand and overseas.

The College was established by Waikato-Tainui to memorialise the 1995 Raupatu settlement between the tribe and the Crown.

It is dedicated to research that will benefit the lives of people with an emphasis on Maori and other indigenous peoples, while being open to research of a more general nature that will benefit New Zealand.

The focus of the College will be on the management of development in the widest context including, but not limited to tribal, cultural, environmental, social and economic development.
